Dear Friends of the Three Rivers College Foundation,

I am pleased and proud to share this year's Annual Report that highlights some of the Foundation's achievements during fiscal year 2014-2015.

The Foundation approved requests for funding that provided additional resources for our students and replaced education equipment that supplemented the class, lab and clinical instruction in many areas of study.

Your generosity enabled us to help Three Rivers' students broaden their horizons by supporting the Cultural and Fine Arts program that provides visual exhibits, theatrical plays, poetry readings, artist talks and musical concerts throughout the year.

Foundation members saw first-hand the return on investment of lab equipment that was purchased in 2010 for the Science Department. The equipment has provided more than 1,000 students the necessary skills for all molecular biologists.

The Foundation also provided funding for the Second Step Players' theatrical performance to raise awareness on the important topic of mental illness for the College community. We also provided funding for a part-time tutor for the Tutoring and Academic Success Center.

In total, the Foundation provided more than \$75,000 to the College in support of program initiatives, projects, state-of-the-art equipment and professional development. Additionally, the TRC Foundation awarded \$310,000 in important scholarship and award funding to deserving students.

This great work was made possible by the generous support we receive from individuals, businesses and organizations that want to make a positive and meaningful difference. Millstone provides sixteen (16) full-tuition scholarships for the nuclear engineering technology degree program for Three Rivers Community College students. Scholarships cover the full cost of tuition, books, and fees for a two-year associate degree program. Students also receive monthly stipends during the nine-month academic year and have a twelve-week paid internship/coop experience at the Millstone Nuclear Station.

Dominion's support allows Three Rivers to be a leading provider of training and education for their nuclear engineering students.

The rigorous nuclear engineering technology program at Three Rivers, led by Professor Jim Sherrard, not only serves as a pipeline to meet local and regional needs but is what makes the program one of the best in the country.

The TRC Foundation awarded the Science Department \$14,000 in 2010 to purchase lab equipment to improve student learning in the field of molecular biology. The funds were used to purchase a polymerase chain reaction thermo cycler, gel electrophoresis chambers and power supplies, micropipettors, and additional lab materials such as pipette stands and microtube racks.

To date, over 1,000 students in 44 sections of BIO 121, General Biology I, have used the equipment while performing laboratory techniques that are cornerstone skills of all molecular biologists. The laboratory exercise is part of a forensic science lab where students use DNA collected at a crime scene to identify which of two suspects is the guilty party.

Thames Valley State Technical Institute Homecoming

It was with a sense of excitement and feelings of anticipation with a bit of trepidation that I returned to this campus for the first time since I graduated in 1965. A bit of déjà vu, as it's the same feelings that I had as a teenager in September 1963, when I joined 114 other students as the first freshman class of what was then called the Norwich State Technical Institute. Back then, the building was brand new, many of the instructors were new to teaching and we were the first class at this new college. At the beginning of our senior year, the school name was changed to Thames Valley State Technical Institute to avoid confusion with the Norwich Regional Vocational Technical School next door. The 114 entering freshmen dwindled to 54 at the start of the senior year and 38 made it to graduation. Today, I am back on campus to meet several of my classmates for a 50th reunion and to take part in the 2015 graduation exercises.

My first impression upon driving into the parking lot and entering the building was, "Wow, what a change!" This was such a far cry from the original two-story brick building no auditorium, no cafeteria, and no gym back then, it was just classrooms and labs. My former classmates were equally bowled over. During the luncheon at the Fireside Room in the library, we shared recollections of the instructors, the demanding course curriculum, the long trimester academic year and the many changes during the two years that we struggled through our courses. A half century had not dimmed those experiences.

My Associate in Applied Science in Mechanical Technology was the entrée into an engineering career that spanned 46 years. I started out as a Technical Aide at General Dynamics / Electric Boat working on a variety of submarine mechanical systems under the guidance of experienced engineers. With the benefit of company-sponsored tuition reimbursement programs for continuing education, I was awarded a Bachelor of Science degree in

mechanical engineering from the University of New Haven in 1971 and was promoted to Engineer.

As soon as I was eligible, I took the 16 hour examination to be a licensed professional engineer in Connecticut. I held this license from 1977 until my retirement.

I joined Perkin-Elmer Corporation's Optical Technology Division in 1978 where design for the Hubble Space Telescope had just started and the KH-9 Hexagon reconnaissance satellite program was well underway, and I was lucky enough to work on both these historic programs. To keep pace with the ever-challenging technology, I went back to night school, and earned a Master of Science degree in mechanical engineering from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in 1986.

In the mid-nineteen nineties defense and aerospace was in decline, and I found myself looking for a change. In a completely different direction, I became an editor at Fine Woodworking magazine in 1996. As it turned out, it was not so different from engineering, as it required all of the same creative and or-

ganizational skills. This was one of my most interesting jobs, but it was financially unsustainable.

Lured back to engineering, I worked for several smaller aerospace companies before forming my own engineering consulting company. I was self-employed for the last 10 years of my career, primarily engaged as a team leader in the design of next-generation computer chip lithography machines.

So there it is: a career in engineering design ranging from inner space to outer space, defense to commercial and a bit of magazine journalism. Looking back, this school changed my life. It gave me the skills and knowledge that I used every single day throughout my entire working career. The tuition was affordable for someone with very modest resources. Although I have earned higher degrees from other colleges, none has had as much personal impact as my associate degree from Thames Valley (now Three Rivers). It all started here.
